

How to change TLS preferences in Firefox ver 37 (and later)

The default value of minimum SSL/TLS version, `security.tls.version.fallback-limit`, can be changed from 3 to 1 at the Firefox configuration (`about:config`).

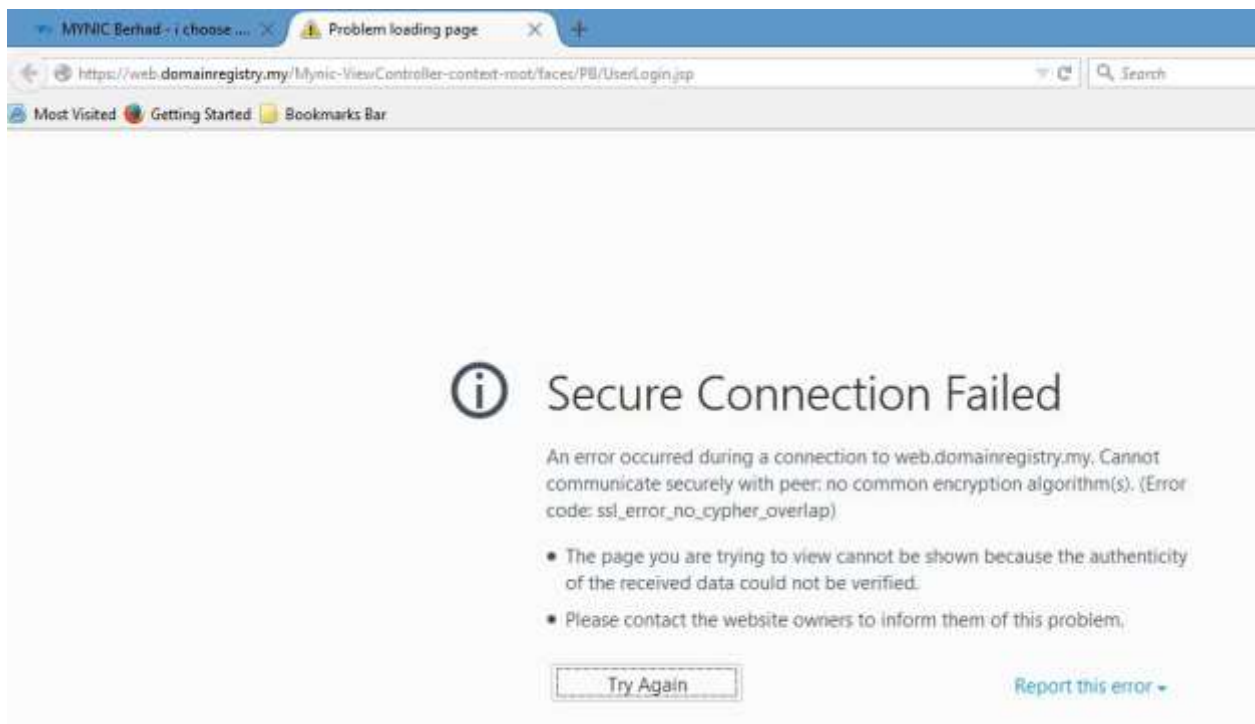
Note:

TLS=Transport Layer Security protocol

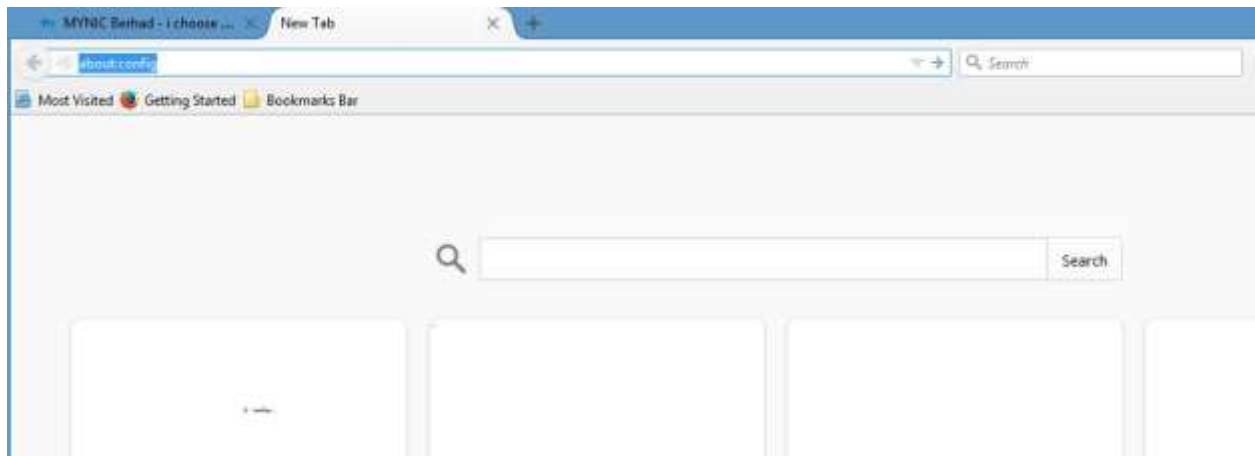
1 means TLS 1.0, 2 means TLS 1.1, 3 means TLS 1.2

Step-by-step guide:

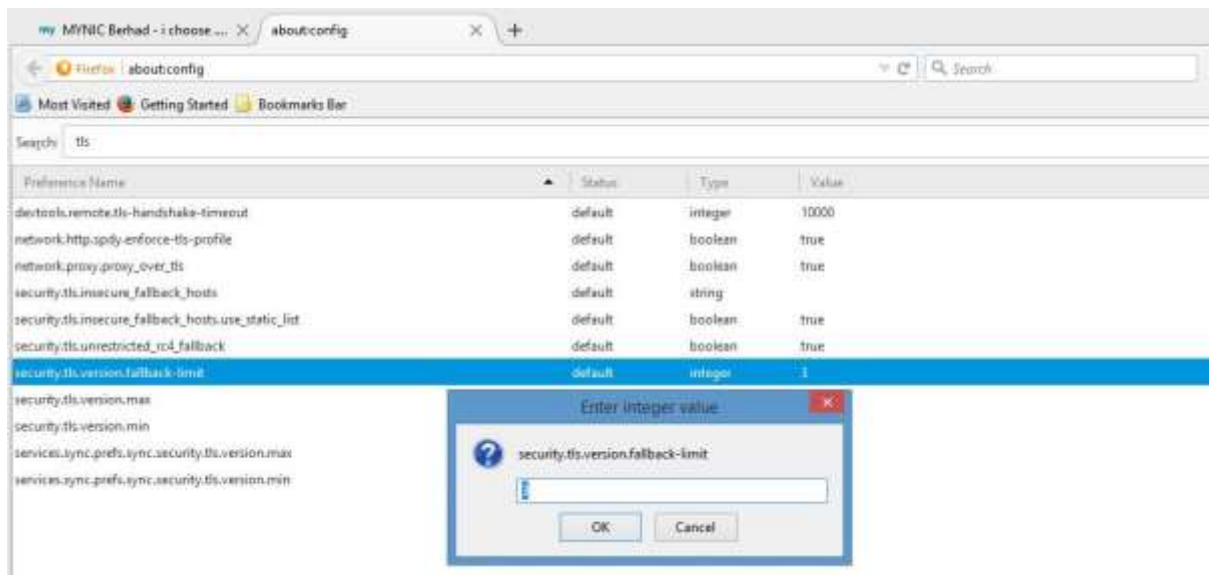
1. Before changing TLS preference, the browser displays the message below:



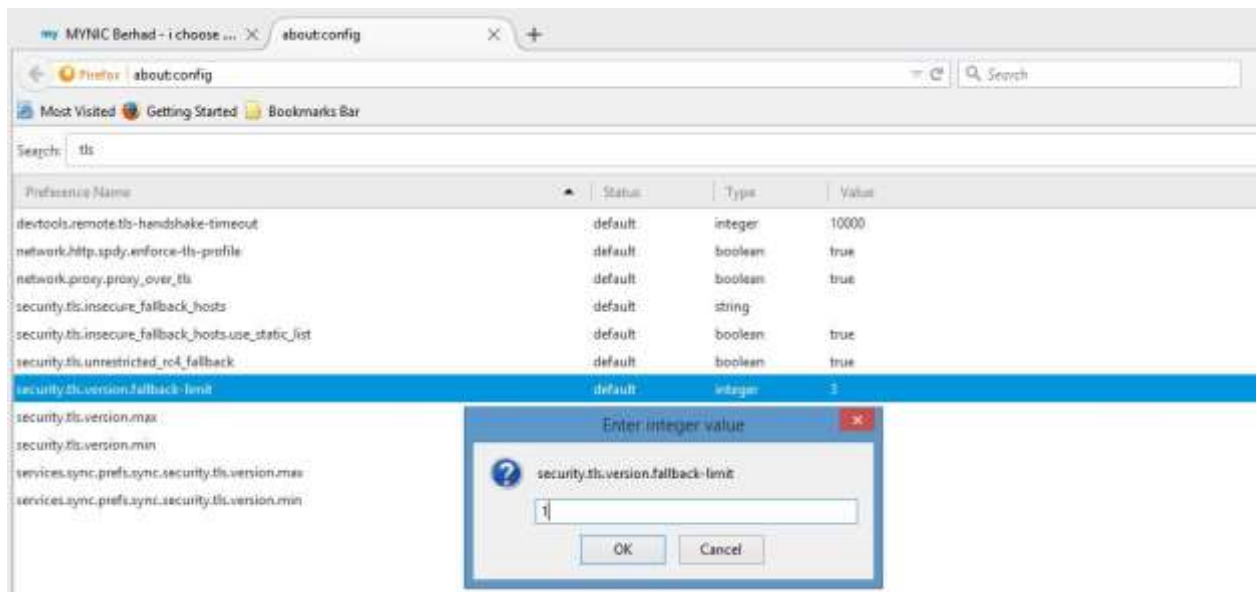
2. At the browser's Location toolbar, type "about:config" to display the list of Firefox configurations.



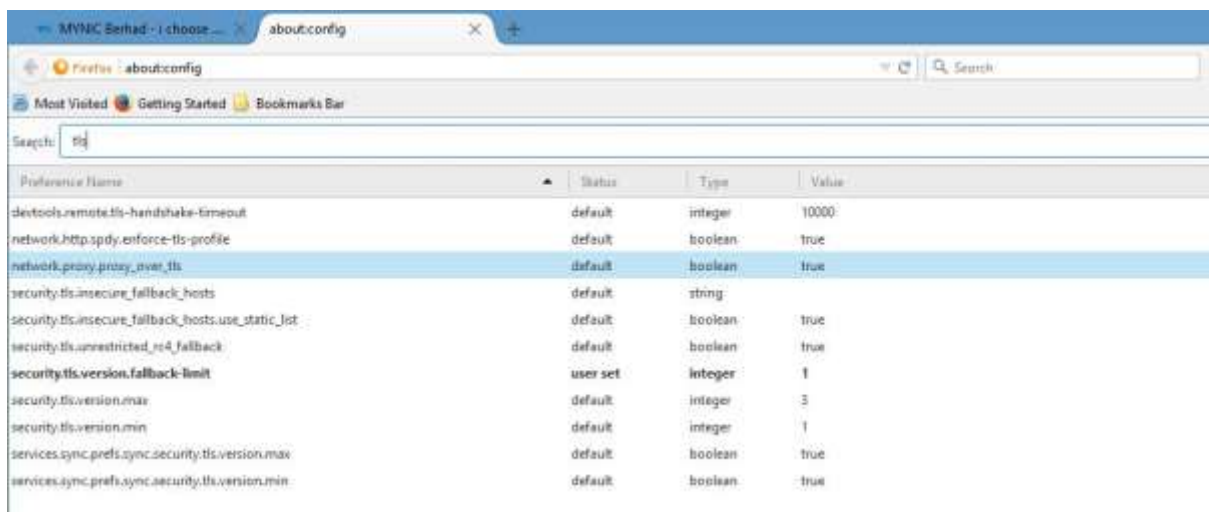
3. At the Search toolbar, type "tls". Locate the "security.tls.version.fallback-limit" preference. Right-click on security.tls.version.fallback-limit and select Modify. The default value is 3.



4. Change the value from 3 to 1. Click OK.



5. The status will be changed to "user-set" having value "1".



6. Now, when you go to the URL, the browser displays the usual page content.
